Eligibility	Entries must be made online no later than 14 January 2020 at 23.59 CET via the link below: https://bwflive.tournamentsoftware.com/onlineentry/onlineentry.aspx?id=84DA0B90-1E7E-4D3A-8E86-77D7EE3D68AF Entries can only be submitted in accordance with "Eligibility" as listed below. Any submitted entries not in accordance with this section will be removed and not included into the event. Compliance with GCR 7.9: "In making or authorising entries, the Member concerned is reconfirming its acceptance, and acceptance by the Players being entered, of the BWF's regulations and Disciplinary processes." All Badminton Europe Member Associations are eligible to compete in the event. Member Associations are allowed to enter: 2 players in men's singles 2 players in women's singles 4 players (or up to 2 pairs) in men's doubles 4 players (or up to 2 pairs) in women's doubles 4 players (or up to 2 pairs) in women's doubles
	4 players (or up to 2 pairs) in mixed doubles The hosting association is entitled to enter one extra player in each of the single events and two extra players in each of the doubles events. No player can play in more than two events. Participants in the 2020 European U15 Championships shall be restricted to players born in 2006 or later.
Substitution	After the closing date for entries, a player who has entered may be unable to take part through illness, injury, or other unavoidable cause. That player's place in singles or doubles or both can be taken by a player from any Member Association as long as that Member Association does not exceed the quota of players for that specific event.
Seeding	Seeding will be made by an independent seeding panel in accordance with an official notification sent to all BEC Member Associations on 4 February 2019. The seeding will be announced on 29 January 2020.
Draw	The draw will be conducted and published on 30 January 2020.

Regulations	The Tournament will be played in accordance with Badminton Europe's regulations as laid down in Appendix X and the Laws and Regulations as adopted by the Badminton World Federation.
Clothing and advertising	Clothing and advertising will be permitted in accordance with the regulations of Badminton Europe's Appendix X – "European U15 Championships", regulations 11 and 12.
	The name of the player on the back of the shirt is optional. (if used, please note that it must comply with BWF rules)
	The name of the player's association on the back is optional. (if used, please note that it must comply with BWF rules)
	In applying regulations on clothing and designs and advertising on players' clothing the decision of the Referee shall be final.
Doping control	Anti-doping testing can be executed on a random basis during the tournament as per BWF and WADA regulations.
	Doping control in badminton, in accordance with BWF Anti-Doping Regulations, is conducted out-of-competition and in-competition with the collection of urine and/or blood samples.
	Athletes are responsible for any substance found in their body. Before an athlete takes any medication, they should check with their doctor, and if necessary, get a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE).

Badminton Integrity	Section 2.4 of the BWF Statutes (Code of Conduct in Relation to Betting, Wagering and Irregular Match Results) relates to anti-corruption and anti-match manipulation, and this code applies to all participants at this tournament. To protect the integrity of BWF sanctioned tournaments, participants are not allowed to bet in any way on badminton matches, respect the principle of fair play, and shall not attempt to influence the course or result of a game or match. Every person has an obligation to report to the BWF any approaches by anyone to gather inside information or to change the outcome of a matches. Insurance	Please make sure that players (and all members of the national delegation) are insured for any damage caused to third parties of any nature (liability insurance contract). Insurance shall also cover the risk of bodily injury, including medical and hospitalization expenses incurred within the host country (France), and all expenses and costs needed for medical repatriation to their country of residence.
Visa Application	It is the responsibility of any nation or player needing a visa to travel to France to make sure that visa applications are made not later than 10 December 2019. Organisers are unable to send supporting letters at a late stage and Embassies are no longer prepared to issue "last minute" visas. The fact that visas cannot be obtained, will NOT be accepted as an excuse for a withdrawal.
