Team Entry Closing date	Team entries must be made online no later than Tuesday 11 August 2020 at 23:59 BWF HQ time (GMT +8) via the link below – https://bwf.tournamentsoftware.com/sport/tournament.aspx?id=B351D63F-A04F-4145-BB94-E79418C3E5AE Player nominations can only be made after the entry deadline has passed.
Eligibility	All Badminton Europe Members are eligible to compete in the event. Participants in the 2020 European Junior Team Championships shall be restricted to players born in 2002 or later .
Seeding	The seeding will be made according to Appendix V (Regulations for the European Junior Team Championships) regulation 7.
Nomination of players	Each competing team must submit nominations of every player it intends to use in the event no later than 26 October 2020 at 23.59 CET , using the same link as for making the team entry (see page 1). Only nominated players shall be permitted to play in the event as selected players or substitutes. No additional players can be added after the player nomination deadline. In this connection we draw your attention to the BWF General Competition Regulations 6 on International Representation.
Format of matches	A team match will consist of 5 matches. 1 men's single, 1 women's single, 1 men's double, 1 women's double and 1 mixed double.
Withdrawal	If a Member withdraws from the Championships, after the entry deadline, but before the draw, for any reason whatsoever, such a Member shall be liable of paying its entry fee and will be penalised by an administrative fine of 1.000,00 EUR. If a Member withdraws from the Championships, after the draw is conducted, for any reason whatsoever, such a Member shall be liable of paying its entry fee and of disciplinary action from BEC's Disciplinary Committee with a maximum fine of 5.000,00 EUR, as per the BEC Disciplinary Regulations, reg. 8.5.







Regulations	The Tournament will be played in accordance with the regulations of the Confederation as laid down in Appendix V – "Regulations for the European Junior Team Championships" and the "Laws and Regulations" as adopted by the Badminton World Federation.
	The European Junior Team Championships will be played in a first stage and a final stage.
	The first stage will be played in groups of three, four or five teams where each team plays all the other teams in the same group.
	The group winners, and possibly group runner(-s) up will progress to the final stage.
	After the closing date for entries, but before the conduction of the draw, Badminton Europe shall announce how many group runner(-s) up that progress to the final stage.
	The final stage shall be a knock-out draw with winning teams progressing to the next round until a winner is found.
Insurance	Any medical treatment necessary away from the sports hall (e.g. at hotels or hospitalisation due to serious illness or injury) is at the players or officials own expense.
	It is recommended that associations of players or individual participants cover these risks by medical insurance.
Doping control	According to the existing law in Finland anti-doping testing can be executed on a random basis during the tournament. Doping control in badminton, in accordance with BWF Anti-Doping Regulations, is conducted out-of-competition and in-competition with the collection of urine and/or blood samples. Athletes are responsible for any substance found in their body. Before an athlete takes any medication, they should check with their doctor, and if necessary, get a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE). Clothing and advertising	Members need to ensure that their players' clothing complies with the existing BWF Regulations and Badminton Europe's Appendix V – "European Junior Team Championships" § 16 and § 17. Failing to do so shall result in an administrative fine of 50,00 EUR for each breach, unless otherwise stated below.
	In team matches players must wear team colours. That is each player must wear the same colour and design of shirts and shorts (or other equivalent articles of clothing) throughout a tie. Failing to do so shall result in an administrative fine of 250,00 EUR for each tie.
	In the final stage it is mandatory that the opposing teams in each tie wear different colours from each other. A team seeded lower or not seeded will be required to wear clothing of a significant different colour. Where both teams are seeded the same or are both not seeded, the team listed lower in the draw will be required to change the colour of clothing. Failing to do so shall result in an administrative fine of 100,00 EUR for each tie.
	Players must wear team colours; that is, each player must wear the same colour and design of shirts and shorts (or other equivalent articles of clothing).
	The name of the player on the back of the shirt is optional.
	The name of the player's country on the back of the shirt is mandatory.
	The Referee is instructed to pay particular attention to uphold these regulations on clothing.
	In applying regulations on clothing and designs and advertising on players' clothing the decision of the Referee shall be final.

Stringing	Yonex will provide stringing service for at the event.







Badminton Integrity	Section 2.4 of the BWF Statutes (Code of Conduct in Relation to Betting, Wagering and Irregular Match Results) relates to anti-corruption and anti- match manipulation, and this code applies to all participants at this tournament. To protect the integrity of BWF sanctioned tournaments, participants are not allowed to bet in any way on badminton matches, respect the principle of fair play, and shall not attempt to influence the course or result of a game or match. Every person has an obligation to report to the BWF any approaches by anyone to gather inside information or to change the outcome of a matches. The fact that visas cannot be obtained, will NOT be accepted as an excuse for a withdrawal.
Official point of arrival	 Helsinki-Vantaa (HEL) Free transport will be provided from this airport to the tournament venue/hotel if accommodation has been booked through the organisation. In case accommodation was not booked through the organisation, more information about transport options and prices will be made available on the event's website. 	Please note that the accommodation offer is available already from Sunday October 25 th so players and teams can arrive at Pajulahti e.g. directly from Finnish Junior (Played in Espoo 2325.10.) or to have a couple days for training at the institute before the tournament.
	The deadline for accommodation bookings is 25 September 2020 (full refund cancellation deadline is 3 October 2020).
